- **Inactive renewal fee is \$30.00 for each license; if post marked after September 30, 2011; a late fee of \$25.00 per year of inactivity, per license will apply.**

Submit the following items required to renew your competency card.

- Copy of your current State License issued by The Department of Business and Professional Regulations (DBPR).

- LIABILITY AND WORKERS COMPENSATION INSURANCE CERTIFICATES MUST CONTAIN THE FOLLOWING:** Marion County as the Certificate Holder including our address: 2710 East Silver Springs Boulevard; Ocala, Florida 34470, ●**The Qualifier's Name** ●**The Company Name as insured,** ● **The Marion County Competency Card Number.** A Minimum Liability Insurance of \$150,000 which consists of \$100,000 per occurrence for Personal Injury and \$50,000 per occurrence for Property Damage.
- IF APPLICANT IS WORKERS COMPENSATION EXEMPT:** Supply copy of Workers Comp Exemption and Marion County Workers Comp Affidavit of compliance

Evidence of workers compensation insurance: Any person, business organization, or qualifying agent who is registered and holds a competency card under Marion County Ordinance 09-23 or by state law and who engages in the business of contracting in this county shall provide evidence of workers compensation insurance pursuant to F.S. Chapter 440. Any workers compensation policy issued outside of this state must maintain the required coverage under a Florida endorsement using Florida rates and rules. The failure to maintain workers compensation coverage as required by law shall be grounds to revoke, suspend, or deny the issuance or renewal of the certificate of competency card.
